## The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

**We celebrate today the mystery of the real presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist that unites our community of faith.**

### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ *1 Corinthians 10:16-17 - Real Communion*

"The Body of Christ" refers to the church as well as to the Eucharist. When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, we have communion with God and with one another.

Jesus is present to us in many ways. We hear his voice in the gospel. We experience his love in our community. We receive him sacramentally in the Eucharist. We are called the Body of Christ because Christ dwells with us.

St. Paul wrote the Corinthians, "Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf."

When we receive communion we experience our communion with one another. Many though we are, we are one in Christ. Just as many grains of wheat make one loaf, just as one loaf is shared by many people, just as many people become one by sharing that one loaf, so do we many become one in Christ. Jesus unites our community when we share our communion together.

Paul's words were especially significant to the Corinthians. He began this letter addressing the divisions in their church and calling the faithful there to unity. At this point in his letter, we understand why. Their unity in the church is critical to the integrity of their worship.

If our Eucharist is to be sincere, our communion must be real. We eat the Body of Christ. We drink the Blood of Christ. We are the Body of Christ.

Each year on the Friday following Corpus Christi Sunday (Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ), we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

This feast day has been celebrated since 1856, but the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the Middle Ages and has been one of the most popular and enduring devotions in the Catholic Church.

We revere the physical heart of Jesus as an emblem of his great love for the human race. As Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque:

**"Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love."**

## MAMAWESINI-TA First Nations and Archdiocese of Saint Boniface Food Sharing Project

The Anishinaabe word “mamawewesini-ta” means “eating together.” In response to a food shortage identified by Indigenous communities in north-eastern Manitoba, the Archdiocese of St. Boniface is undertaking a food-sharing project. The communities are: Sagkeeng, Hollow Water, Bloodvein, Little Grand Rapids, Pauingassi, Berens River and Poplar River First Nations, as well as others such as Manigotagan and Seymourville. These communities are already tackling the food shortage for many of their members. However, the needs in this time of COVID-19 are greater than what both Band Councils and Winnipeg Harvest can respond to. We invite all the faithful of the Archdiocese, starting with the city parishes, to donate food (non-perishable) or money to this food drive. The foods most needed include: sugar, flour, yeast, peanut butter, soups, pasta sauce, pasta, oatmeal, brown sugar, canned processed meat, canned salmon or tuna, baby food, Cheese Whiz, dried peas, granola bars, cookies, crackers, Jello, rice, puddings, jams, dried beans, cream of wheat, pork & beans.

**SSVP wants to help US help the Food Sharing Project! You may drop off food items in the SSVP FOOD BIN at the Parish of St. Timothy until June 24** and SSVP will deliver it to Christ the King Parish for distribution. Check the list of the most needed food items in the above letter.

## Reminder about SUNDAY MASSES (as of June 5, 2020)

We are all so filled with joy that we are able to return to our regularly scheduled Sunday mass times! Yes, it is with only up to 25 people per mass, but it is a start! Please read the following updated information for all the "how-to's"!

**MASS returns to SATURDAY at 4 PM\* & SUNDAY 9 AM & 11 AM**

**\*Saturday's mass will be recorded for later viewing on via our website**

**Please EMAIL or CALL to request to attend Weekend Mass:**

**In order for everyone to get an opportunity to attend mass, please email ([info@st-timothy.ca](mailto:info@st-timothy.ca)) or call the office (204-949-3760) to reserve a spot at your preferred mass time.**

- **Reservations by phone or email will only be accepted on the Wednesday and Thursday immediately before the weekend you hope to attend mass.**
- **We will ask for the names** of all people in your household who will be attending, plus a phone number, for contact tracing purposes as required by the Public Health Officials.
- **We must strictly enforce the 25 person maximum** for each mass in order to be compliant with the Public Health Officials.
- If you have no preference of mass time, please indicate so.
- **We will confirm your attendance via email or return phone call.** (Please wait for confirmation before you plan to attend mass.)
- **Also, if you get confirmation of your attendance at mass, please be sure you attend that mass!** If you cannot attend, please email or call the parish office as soon as possible.
- **Arriving for Mass:** Entrance to the church will be through the north doors only (closest to the parish office). Doors open 30 minutes before mass. **Please arrive at least 10-15 minutes before mass** as there may be slight delays entering the church due to the brief sign-in process.

**BEFORE REQUESTING TO PARTICIPATE IN MASS, PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING:**

**You should not attend mass** if you or someone in your household is exhibiting cold or flu-like symptoms, recently travelled outside of Manitoba or been in contact with someone who has tested positive for the coronavirus.

**There are plastic chairs** physically distanced in the worship space; you must sit in one of these chairs so they may be disinfected after mass by volunteers.

**As per direction from the office of the St. Boniface Archdiocese:**

**Facemasks:** It is strongly recommended that all people attending mass bring and wear masks.

**Music and Congregational Singing:** While we will have an accompanist and singer, singing by the greater church community is not recommended. Hymnals have been removed from the church.

**Offertory Collection:** We will have a collection basket for your Sunday offering just inside the worship space doors. Please drop your offering in the basket before mass as collection will not be taken during mass.

**Sign of Peace:** The sign of peace will be expressed with a bow of the head toward one's neighbour.

## Reminder about SUNDAY MASSES as of June 5, 2020 (continued from previous page)

**Communion Procession:** Physical distancing must be maintained during the Communion procession. The distribution of communion will be done by Fr. Chrys alone, who will be wearing a mask at the time of communion. Communion from the chalice (Precious Blood) is to be discontinued during this time. Communion is only allowed to be distributed on the hand of each communicant at this time. Great care will be taken to not make physical contact.

### If You Cannot Attend Mass on Sunday:

**Dispensation from Sunday Obligation:** While we continue to move toward a total opening, the dispensation from the Sunday obligation to physically attend Mass is granted to the faithful until the end of the pandemic (cf. Code of Canon Law, 87).

**The 4 pm mass on Saturday will be recorded** for viewing later on for those who are not able to attend mass. Links to watch mass continues to be on our parish website. **(Please note that if you attend the 4 pm mass, you may be recorded.)**

## Reminder about WEEKDAY MASSES

**Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday at 9:30 am (“first come” basis up to 25 people)**

**(Plus this Friday, June 19th at 9:30 am for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Sacred Heart of Jesus)**

**Again, gathering is limited to 25 people including Father Chrys and designated ministers.**

Weekday mass will be on a first come, first serve basis. However upon arrival, attendees must write their name and phone number on contact tracing forms. Please arrive at least 10 minutes before mass begins. Note that you will be able to enter the church shortly before 9 am to pray the Rosary before mass, if you so choose.

**The Tuesday morning mass at 9:30 am will be live streamed** on Facebook to be watched live or at your convenience on Facebook.

**Tuesday morning mass will be followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** until 12 noon.

Please join us to pray the **Rosary at 9 am (before mass) on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.**

**Mass with Anointing of the Sick on the first Thursday of the month is still postponed. Anointing of the Sick is available on request.** Please contact Fr. Chrys directly at [fr.chrys@st-timothy.ca](mailto:fr.chrys@st-timothy.ca) or 204-257-3723 or leave a message at the parish office at 204-949-3760.

**CAN YOU HELP?** We'll need help at both weekend and weekday masses, setting up the altar for mass (much simpler than usual), monitoring the doors, signing in parishioners as they arrive, and sanitizing the chairs and surfaces after each mass. If you can help with one or more of these duties occasionally, please let Grace know when you register for mass. Training will be provided.
