

Public Health Orders Reminders:

Capacity for indoor faith-based gatherings (Mass), including weddings, funerals and baptisms are now open to 50 per cent capacity, with physical distancing protocols in place.

In order to maintain physical distancing between households at the Parish of St. Timothy, we will keep our capacity to about 95 people in the worship space for all faith-based gatherings.

Important Notes Before You Come to Mass

Upon entry, please **sanitize your hands and self-screen for COVID-19**.

You will be required to **print your name and contact information on the contact tracing list** and initial that you've answered the self-screening questions.

Doors open 30 minutes before Mass. **Please arrive at least 10-15 minutes before Mass** to allow extra time to sign-in and self-screen for Covid-19.

Masks are Mandatory: Masks are now required for all indoor public places, including churches, effective August 28, 2021.

Mass attendance is on a first come, first seated basis. Enter through the north doors.

Please only attend Mass if:

- you do not have symptoms of COVID-19,
- you are not required to self-isolate due to close contact with someone with COVID-19* or due to travel* (*if you are fully [double] vaccinated, you are exempt as per provincial health orders).

A Message from Fr. Brian Trueman



“Who do you say that I am?”

In our Gospel this Sunday, Jesus turns to his disciples and asks them who people say that he is. There are all sorts of answers to this question, and perhaps we've heard these answers in many different ways from others or from the culture: he was a teacher, a healer, a good guy, a political activist, he said some nice things, etc. All of these answers are certainly true, but imperfect. They don't really get to the heart of who he is. None of these answers truly require a total commitment of self. Just as Jesus asks his disciples, he also asks us to give an answer that truly must come from the heart, an answer of faith: “You are the Christ.”

Have you always wanted to get to know more about who Jesus truly is? Do you feel a call to a deeper relationship with God? Do you long for the adventure to live life to the

full in the family of the Church? Are you seeking the answers to deeper questions, meaning, and real happiness in life? Are you hungry to dive deeper into your Catholic faith?

If this is you or if it describes someone one may know, contact Fr. Brian Trueman to join in a time of prayer, seeking, and reflection on these important topics and many more. This period of journeying together, seeking answers to questions of life, with the possibility of being welcomed into the family of God is what we would call RCIA.

What is RCIA? It simply stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. RCIA is a period where those who are unbaptized or those who were perhaps baptized in another Christian denomination might be interested in becoming Catholic, and of entering more fully into the life of faith in the Catholic Church. Such a period is also great for Catholics who were baptised but not Confirmed, or for those who have fallen away from their faith and would like to journey home.

Due to the ever changing and limiting nature of the current pandemic, I'm still working out different options for regular meetings for all of us “seekers” on a journey for spiritual fulfillment. I hope that it could be in-person, but will also be able to make such a journey possible virtually via Zoom, depending on how things evolve.




THE RELUCTANT SAINT: THE STORY OF ST. JOSEPH OF CUPERTINO
