

### Attendance at Mass as of August 22, 2020

The Province of Manitoba has eased restrictions for faith-based gatherings. The Parish of St. Timothy is now able to accommodate **85 participants**, including the presider and ministers, providing physical distancing and sanitizing measures are followed.

**Registration for Sunday mass is no longer necessary at this time.** With the increased numbers allowed at St. Tim's, we have not had to turn anyone away. If you want to ensure a place at mass for yourself and your family, you are welcome to call ahead (204-949-3760) or email (info@st-timothy.ca) on Wednesday or Thursday until 3 pm to reserve a place for you. Please watch the bulletin and check our website for the most up-to-date information.

### Arriving for Mass:

Entrance to the church is through the **north doors only** (closest to the parish office). Doors open 30 minutes before mass.

**Please arrive at least 15 minutes before mass** as there may be slight delays entering the church due to the brief sign-in process on the contact tracing forms and the screening process.

**Screening: You will need to confirm that neither you nor anyone in your household is exhibiting cold or flu-like symptoms, nor recently travelled to restricted areas nor been in contact with someone who has tested positive for the corona virus.** The doors must be locked after we reach our maximum allowable numbers or by the time mass begins. [So don't be late:]

### If You Cannot Attend Mass

**If you cannot attend mass, we are still recording the 4 pm mass for later viewing.** It is usually available to view starting Saturday evening. Go to [st-timothy.ca](http://st-timothy.ca) website for the viewing link.

**The Tuesday morning mass at 9:30 am is live streamed on Facebook** to be watched live or at your convenience on Facebook.

**Dispensation from Sunday Obligation:** While we continue to move toward a total opening, the dispensation from the Sunday obligation to physically attend Mass is granted to the faithful until the end of the pandemic (cf. Code of Canon Law, 87).
